I'm going to say something scary, so brace yourselves. We need to talk about evangelism. Ok, I said it. Everyone ok? Did we all make it?



All joking aside, we really do have to talk about evangelism. I know that word can bring up images of street corner preachers with megaphones on soapboxes, but stay with me. I want to help us all take the fear out of that word. Let me do that by offering a different picture of evangelism.

Imagine you are in a group or a club that is made up of some church friends and some folks who are not so much into the whole church thing. You meet to do or enjoy something that you all love. Maybe it is a book club, a gardening group, a crafting circle, a collection of people who love to serve in the community, a group of folks who love to watch baseball together, or if you are like me, a board game get together. You spend a lot of time getting to know everyone in the group. You meet regularly and you text, call, message, and share funny pictures when you aren't together. It is also a group that shares grief together. When someone is sick, down on their luck, or loses a loved one, this group is there for them. You know you can depend on them too. Deep relationships and friendships have been made here. Everyone is so excited about being together that when you meet someone else with the same interest that you all share, you are so excited to invite them to join your group.

One day, one of the folks in the group that is in the "no church, thank you" contingent strikes up a conversation with you about your faith and you have the chance to share about why it is important to you. Or, maybe they are going through a tough time, and you feel a nudge to ask them if they would like to pray with you. Or, it could be that after getting to know you, seeing the way that you live your life and the way that you care for everyone around you, this person asks you what the source of your love for the world is, and now you have the chance to say "it comes from my faith."

Evangelism is not very effective when there is no relationship built between you and folks that you want to share your faith with. The relationships that you build need to be natural ones that do not have any agenda to them other than your want to love fellow members of creation. When we build community that is supportive, safe, and authentic, we will feel the movement of the Holy Spirit and know when we can have faith conversations that come from the heart. Our job is not to bring God to people; there is nowhere on earth where God is not already present. Our job is to point out where we see God working in our lives and in the lives of others who may not be inclined to notice, and to always do so with love.

BACKPACK MINISTRY - Our first food delivery to Redbud Run Elementary School was on November 4. We provided weekend food to 55 students. Since then, our number has increased to 59. As we continue to serve these students twice a month, our shelves are constantly in need of restocking.

WATTS & Braddock Street—January 9-16, 2021

Braddock Street hosts WATTS next month. To keep all churches healthy, WATTS has been allowed to lease the Fellowship Hall at the old First United Methodist Church for the entire 20 weeks. This new location will bring many changes to how we normally host WATTS during our week, January 9-16. For 12 years, Braddock Street has been able to provide refuge from the winter cold for up to 35 homeless guests. In 2021, we will be providing hot meals, hot showers (in a shower trailer at FUMC), and most importantly, fellowship to 35 guests. Meals will have to be made off-site, and we will need 6-10 volunteers a night to do a variety of duties. Of course, volunteers will have to have a health check and wear a mask.

If you would like to support WATTS week financially, please make your check payable to BSUMC and put WATTS in the memo line. These donations will be used to purchase food and supplies as well as thermal underwear for our guests. While we are at First UMC, WATTS will be renting a shower trailer, and guests will be allowed to shower at least three days a week. We will need donations of underwear and white undershirts. We will also need items like Kleenex, disposable razors, shaving cream, toothbrushes and toothpaste. Please limit your donations to travel size items only. We also need a donation of Lysol sanitizing spray. Items can be left in the Mission room (room 134).
